Dear Mr. Gutierrez Verduzco,

We have received your request dated April 14<sup>th</sup>, 2026 to access videosurveillance footage of Ms. [REDACTED] and her minor child at the Airport between March 20<sup>th</sup> and March 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2026.

After careful examination of your request, Aéroports de Montréal ("ADM") regrets to inform you that it has been denied for the following reason :

- Disclosure of the information would be likely to reveal personal information regarding a third party.

The videosurveillance footage requested, in their full and uninterrupted form, captured in public areas of the airport, contain personal information relating to a large number of third parties. Pursuant to section 9(1) of the *Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents Act* (hereinafter "**PIPEDA**"), an organization must refuse an access request if the disclosure of the requested information is likely to reveal personal information regarding third parties. While an organization is allowed to remove or mask third-party information where reasonable, doing so in this case would require a detailed review of approximately seventy-two (72) hours of videosurveillance footage and the blurring of every other identifiable individual appearing in the recordings. Given the volume of footage requested, this process would be unreasonable and disproportionate to the scope of the right of access. Please note that, should your request relate to interactions involving officers of the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA), you may submit a separate access request directly to the CBSA, as such recordings are not under the control of Aéroports de Montréal.

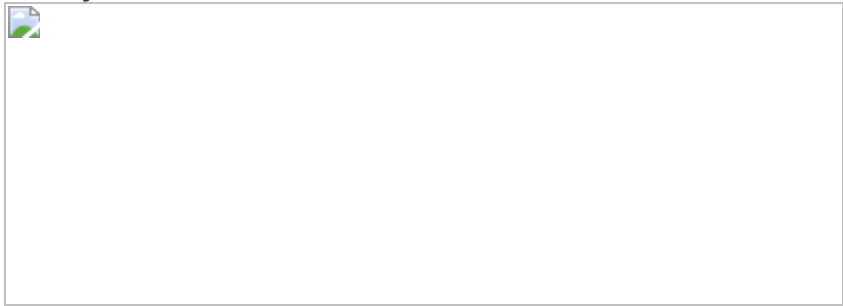
Furthermore, your request is made in the context of ongoing proceedings before the Federal Court. PIPEDA is not intended to serve as a substitute for the discovery or production processes available in that forum, and access requests should not be used to circumvent those procedural mechanisms.

Please note that if you are not satisfied with this decision, you may bring a complaint before the Privacy Commissioner of Canada or before the *Commission d'accès à l'information* (CAI).
