Dear Victor Manuel Gutierrez Verduzco:

Your request pursuant to the Access to Information Act was received in our office on April 13, 2026, and reads:

"I request all personal information held by CBSA relating to me, GUTIERREZ VERDUZCO, Victor Manuel (UCI 11-5347-7808), for the period March 20-24, 2026. I arrived at YUL Montreal-Trudeau airport on March 20, 2026 (flight AC925 from Mexico) with my former spouse and minor child to seek refugee protection. I was processed at the port of entry, found inadmissible under s.44(1) IRPA, detained, and transferred to the Immigration Holding Centre (IRC) in Laval. I was released on March 24, 2026 following a detention review before Member Yves Dumoulin.

Specifically, I request:

1. All CCTV, surveillance footage, and audio/video recordings in their entirety from YUL airport for March 20-21, 2026, covering all areas where I was present including but not limited to: primary inspection, secondary examination and interview rooms, waiting and holding areas, hallways, corridors, cells, and any common areas. Complete, continuous, uninterrupted recordings.
2. All documents, reports, forms, notes, and communications related to my case for the period March 20-24, 2026, including but not limited to: the s.44(1) inadmissibility report, officer reports (M-1, C-1, BSF561 or otherwise), GCMS notes and system entries, IMM forms (IMM-5317, IMM-5480, IMM-1282), withdrawal or consent forms, detention records from IRC Laval (intake, incident reports), internal communications between CBSA officers (emails, memos, notes), port of entry processing records (officer notes, interview notes), and documents referencing interpreter services.
3. Travel history records (entry and exit) for the date range specified.
4. Any other records containing my personal information for this period not covered above. {DOB: 1985-09-28}"

An extension of time of up to 30 days beyond the 30 day statutory time limit will be required in order to process this request. This extension is being applied in accordance with the Act as meeting the original time limit would unreasonably interfere with the operations of the Agency.

The Canada Border Services Agency is committed to assist you with your request and will ensure that every reasonable effort is made to help you receive a complete, accurate and timely response.
